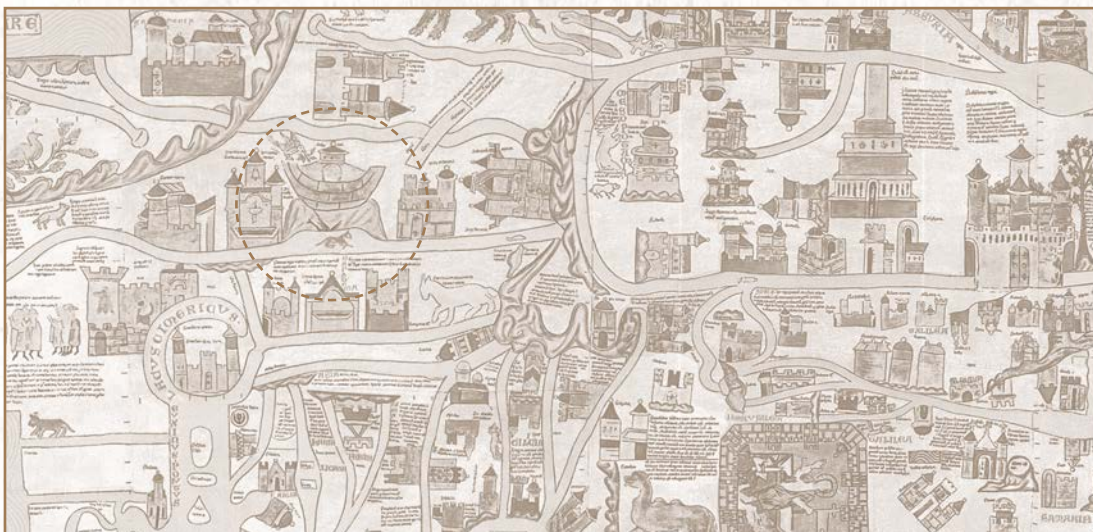

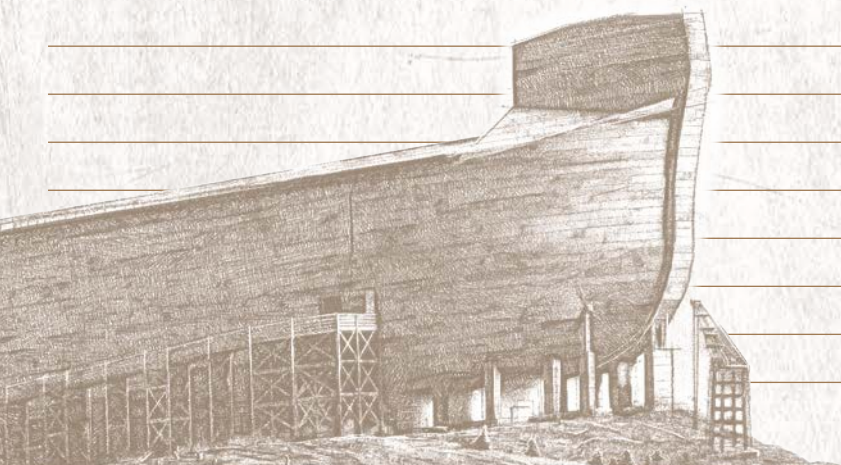
The words spoken by Lamech, Noah's father, may indicate that he worked hard at farming the land. Thus, Noah may have learned how to plant crops and care for animals at an early age. The name Noah means "rest" and his father hoped that he would bring rest from their hard work because of the curse on the ground. Noah was born a little more than a thousand years after God created everything, and the enormous task of building the Ark and caring for the animals likely required a variety of skills, such as growing crops, animal husbandry, woodworking, metalworking, and leadership.

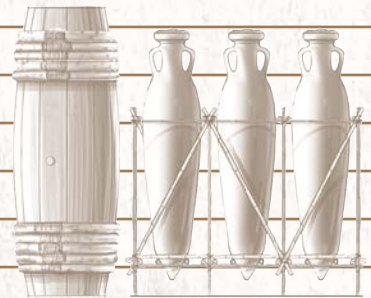
